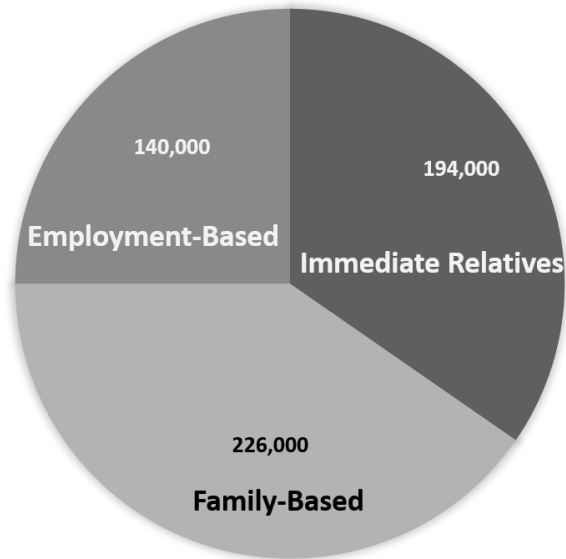


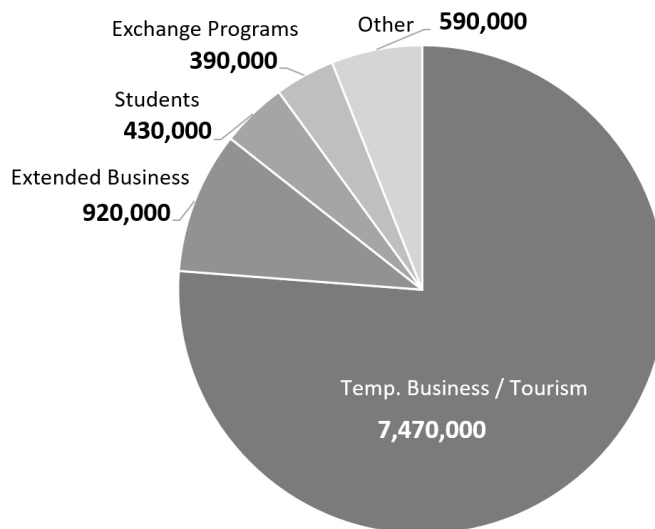

- **Perceptions and Realities**
 - Not immigration, but an invasion?
 - Unauthorized immigration has declined for 18 the past 19 years
 - The total number of undocumented immigrants has leveled out
 - Deportations appear to be declining, both at the border and in the interior
 - Immigrants increase crime?
 - Immigrants typically have lower crime rates than native born Americans
 - Do it the right way – Wait your turn in line?
 - The backlog for “standing in line” typically exceeds a decade
